

Primary gastric small lymphocytic lymphoma with perforation.

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摘要

Abstract

The gastrointestinal tract is commonly involved by chronic lymphocytic leukaemia/small lymphocytic lymphoma (CLL/SLL) with diffuse infiltration by small round lymphocytes without follicle formation or lymphoepithelial lesions.¹ Primary gastric SLL is extremely rare and has never been characterized. We report such a case which presented with perforation. A 84-year-old female presented with a 12-h history of right upper quadrant abdominal pain and abdominal X-ray showed abdominal free air. Her medical history revealed hypertension with irregular medication, a previous operation for cataract, left eye blindness and chronic renal insufficiency.
