INSTRUCTIONS TO AUTHORS

I. Editorial Policy

The New Taipei Journal of Medicine publishes studies on all the disciplines of the medical sciences. Research areas covered in the journal include all primarily original investigations in the broad field of clinical and basic medical sciences.

It provides a medium for publication of original research articles, case reports, notes, communications. impressive, clinicopathological conference, special features or reviews. A contribution may be submitted in the form of a full paper, a note, or a communication. A full paper should cover its subject matter thoroughly, clearly and completely. The abstract of a full paper should be brief, of 200 words maximum. A note, having an abstract of about 100 words, is intended to describe essentially complete pieces of work which are of insufficient length to justify a full paper; however, full experimental details are required. A communication, also having an abstract of about 100 words, should report preliminary results of which immediate availability to the scientific community is deemed important; it should normally occupy not more than four pages of typescript, including tables, figures and text.

All manuscripts will be referred by at least two experts in the research area of the paper. When revision is necessary, the manuscript with the comments of the refers is returned to the authors. Revised manuscripts must be resubmitted to the corresponding senior editor in duplicate with all pages affected by retyping. If English is not the author's native language, the manuscript will be checked by English editor before publishing and the fee will go to the corresponding author. The final decision on any manuscript rests with the editor.

Submission of manuscripts to The New Taipei Journal of Medicine implies that they represent original research not previously published (except in te form of an abstract or preliminary report) and they are not being considered for publication elsewhere in the same form, in any language, without the consent of the editor. By accepting a manuscript the journal acquires all rights, in

particular copyright and the rights of translation.

II. Submission of Manuscripts

Format: Manuscript should be printed, double spaced, one side only, on 22 × 28 cm or A4 paper with 2.54cm (1 inch) margins on all sides. Each copy must include all tables, figures, structures, and schemes. The original manuscript should include the camera-ready copies of the figures, structural formulas, and schemes; these should be placed at the end. Authors should indicate by text where the tables, figures, structures, and schemes are to be inserted. Separate sheets should be used for the title page, with authors' names and affiliations, and for the abstract. All pages should be numbered consecutively, starting with the title page and continued in the following order: text, experimental, references, tables, figures, legends, structures and schemes.

Title: The title should reflect the purposes and findings of the work in order to provide maximum information in a computerized title search. Titles should be followed by the authors' full names and by the addresses of all contributing laboratories. The name of the corresponding author should be marked with an asterisk (*).

Abstract: Every manuscript must include an abstract (80-200 words) describing briefly and clearly the purpose of the research, results and conclusions. A maximum of 6 key words and 50 letters (including space) of the running title followed the abstract must be provided by the authors.

Headings: The manuscript can be organized under headings such as "INTRODUCTION, RESULTS, DISCUSSION" (or "RESULTS AND DISCUSSION"), and "EXPERIMENTAL SECTION" or "INTRODUC-
