The United States government's Consumer Product Safety Commission recently <u>26</u> a new lab for testing products. Products both imported and those produced domestically will be analyzed for safety and quality <u>28</u> . Russian billionaire Roman Abramovich is the <u>31</u> owner of the world's biggest yacht, the <i>Eclipse</i> . This stunning boat is 557 feet long and contains some of the most <u>32</u> equipment ever installed on a yacht. The ship features a missile-defense system, underwater motion-and-heat sensors, and anti-paparazzi lasers to protect Abramovich's <u>33</u> . There's also a 12-seat anti-piracy submarine that can be launched through a hatch in the ship's hull, and it can dive to a depth of 160 feet.							

To <u>34</u> Abramovich to join the yacht while it is at sea, there are two helicopter landing pads and a hangar large enough for two helicopters. Accommodations for guests include two swimming pools, three dining rooms, a cinema and a medical clinic. The *Eclipse* is the third mega-yacht in Abramovich's fleet and is <u>35</u> by a crew of 70. At a cost of \$1.2 billion, the *Eclipse* is also the world's most expensive yacht.
